We Are Still On Course!

I remember those many exciting family vacations over the years. Like the car trip to New York City. You know how it goes, right? We are not even one hundred miles down the road and the kids are already shouting from the back seat, "Are we there yet?" I'm thinking, "Are you kidding me? We just left the house." As familiar as that experience sounds, it is certainly true in the journey that CB North Central has recently taken. Last month in the newsletter, I commented that our GPS is on and tracking our course to a new and revitalized future. Good news! We are still on course.

With the need to bring significant change, the Regional Mapping process began with my request for CBAmerica and fellow Regional Directors to look into the ministry of CB North Central. The mission for the evaluation was to discover if we are focused on "reproductive health" in the reproduction of maturing believers, next generation leaders and healthy church plants. Getting input from our regional churches was vital to understanding this

objective. We sent surveys to well over a hundred churches and were returned on May 3, 2013. I want to thank every pastor and church leader who participated in the online survey. Your honest responses and insightful comments are giving us clear direction as we strategically plan for the future.

The survey results revealed some strengths or positive trends that were good to see. Here are just a few that may encourage you as well:

1. Of the 111 churches in the Region, 67 or 61% (83 respondents) of the churches participated. Though we hoped for 100% involvement, over 50% is a significant representation.
2. Churches scored above the 80% agree level that there is agreement of values between the churches and churches to the region concerning an opportunity for a missional partnership.
3. There is strong doctrinal alignment or unity within our region. 90% of the respondents found some sort of commonality with the Regional Doctrinal Statement.
4. The majority of respondents indicated the Regional resources and services provided to the churches were helpful.
5. 65 of the 83 respondents identified themselves as a "Pastor" and 44 of those indicated that they have been involved in the Pastor Cluster Groups.

This is where the real work begins and that is responding to the areas that showed concern or need for improvement. Here are some weaknesses that we plan on addressing:

1. There is inadequate communication of Regional identity to the churches. Only 61% of the respondents have a clear understanding of the mission, vision and values of CB North Central.
2. Many responding to the survey were uncertain of the CBAmerica identity regarding its mission, vision, values, and relationship to their church.
3. There is a disconnection between churches to the region and in church-to-church relationships. The size of our region and sparseness of the churches contribute to this

a healthy church.

Healthy NCD is seeing a steady growth through conversions and the ongoing discipleship of those who are part of the church.

4. The pastoral age demographic of those completing the survey was very high. 72% of the pastoral respondents were 50+ years old and 40% fell into the 50 to 60 years old category.
5. The Region is not adequately assisting churches in the spiritual reproduction of believers, leaders, and churches. Though there is alignment to the mission, it is not being communicated.

Do you remember what I said earlier? Our GPS is on and we are on the road to a new journey. We are not quite there yet, but it does start right here. TODAY! Yes, there are some positive things happening in the region. And yes, we have much room for improvement. On Jun 19-20, the entire board is meeting in Eau Claire, WI to process the survey results and begin the steps for positive change. Please pray for us as we seek God's guidance for the future.

The score could have been much worse, but our goal keeper made several nice saves and the opposing team missed several very easy shots. As a former soccer player and avid soccer fan, the most frustrating thing was that we weren't able to make the necessary adjustments and we continued to give up these opportunities time and time again.

As pastors and church leaders, we are often called on to make adjustments in ministry. That can include casting a new vision, setting new goals, or laying out a new mission or purpose statement for our church congregation. And unfortunately, these are sometimes very much "man-laid" plans or goals and we simply ask God to "rubber stamp" our plans with a prayer seeking God's blessings on "our" goals.

Our church staff has been reading Henry Blackaby's book, ***Spiritual Leadership: The Interactive Study***, early on in the book Blackaby writes,

"People usually assume that along with the role of leader comes the responsibility of determining what should be done. They develop aggressive goals. They dream grandiose dreams. They cast grand visions. Then they pray and ask God to back them up and bless their efforts. That's not what spiritual leaders do. Spiritual leaders seek God's will, whether it is for their church or for their corporation, and then they marshal their people to pursue God's plan."

Even when it comes to making necessary ministry adjustments, we desperately need to know the heart and mind of God rather than just plowing ahead and hoping God will bless our efforts. In Exodus 33, God commands Moses to take the people and go to the land that He had promised to give them. God promised to send an angel to drive out all the other people groups from the land, but God also declared in chapter 33 that He would not go with Moses and the Israelites. Their disobedience, their rebellion, their complaining, and their idolatry had become so unbearable that God declared that He would not go with them.

Moses knew that being called into a relationship with the Living God and being led by God was what set the Israelites apart from the rest of the people groups. He knew they would be in a

hopeless situation if they went up on their own. Listen to Moses' words from Exodus 33:15-16, "If your presence does not go with us, do not send us up from here... What else will distinguish me and your people from all the other people on the face of the earth?"

As a church leader facing the need and the opportunity to make some adjustments in your congregation, don't try to dream big dreams for God or cast great visions and simply add your token prayer for God to bless "your" plans. Remember, His presence and our relationship with Him is what sets us apart. To make adjustments apart from God is a recipe for failure. Moses knew it which is why he declared that God's presence was the only distinguishing characteristic that mattered.

A month ago I had the opportunity to give the invocation at the state Senate meeting here in Michigan. The Lord directed me to **1 Kings 3** where King Solomon was overwhelmed with the responsibility of leading God's people. In his prayer for wisdom, he cries out, "***...I am only a little child and do not know how to carry out my duties... So give your servant a discerning heart to govern your people and to distinguish between right and wrong...***"

Our government officials are not the only ones needing that wisdom and discernment, we do as well. May we have the same kind of humility and the same passionate plea for wisdom that expressed as we lead shepherd God's people in our local congregations.

YOUTH PASTOR TO YOUTH PASTOR

I am a firm believer that Sunday school in America is broke. It is generally held at a time when many participants are still waking up and incoherent. It is often taught by unenthusiastic and worn out

volunteers. Plus, if you are a teenager you're lucky enough to get a seat on a stinky broken couch that sits three inches off the floor.

The adults don't have things a whole lot better. In their Sunday school class they get to watch a video on the big screen all while facing the same direction (forward) in the sanctuary. After the video is through a facilitator will read some discussion questions from the front which allows the participants to give safe and shallow answers which the rest of the congregation may or may not hear.

This past year I was on a mission in my church. This mission was twofold: to bridge the gap between multiple generations and to change the broken format of Sunday school. I began to wonder what would happen if high school students and adults actually had a class together. I wondered what would happen if instead of one facilitator who read questions off a pamphlet there were multiple group discussion leaders. What if those groups sat on *chairs* instead of stinky couches? What if the groups sat in circles and faced *each other* instead of forward in pews? What if the questions were about *real life* and *shared experiences* instead of the obvious, "Who was Jesus speaking to when he said...?"

When I pitched the idea of combined Sunday school to a few adults in my church they didn't seem sold on the idea. I would get responses like, "Well, I suppose we can try it and see how it goes." The youth (to no surprise) hated the idea! In order to prolong everyone's suffering, I decided to find the longest video series I could find which was produced by Josh and Sean McDowell called "The Unshakable Truth." It lasted a gigantic 12 weeks!

The results of the experiment were *extremely* positive. The far majority of adults loved having the youth in the class, and would you believe that the teenagers felt the same way? By combining youth and adults around discussion tables, the adults were able to speak into the lives of teens and in return receive perspectives they may not have themselves ever considered. The people liked the new format so much that they decided to polish off the school year with *another* eight weeklong series!

It's hard to believe that this simplistic change was so revolutionary in my church. After all, it wasn't rocket science - just a willingness to take a risk and change the way something had "always been

done." I pray that other churches would be willing to attempt such risks and reap such rewards of their own in the future.
